On this recording Bill M portraying Bill Wilson, is speaking on the day that Doctor Bob died in 1950. Bill M has taken information from many of Bill Wilson's speeches and writings and combined them into a well delivered narrative which will take you on the journey up to, and including the meeting of Bill and Bob at the Gatehouse, and continues on the path of their vision of salvation and how they wanted to share it with other Drunks.

This Historical Story-Telling contains information about Bill Wilson that had never been heard before. Based on re-enactments of historically accurate conversations and speeches, this intimate sharing of Bill W portrayed so well by Bill M, recalls significant moments in his life, his downward spiral into alcoholism, his climb out of the doleful pit of suffering, and his ultimate redemption..

His distress and misfortunes are well documented in the actual scenarios that take place in your "mind's Eye" as you follow the story. Bill, demoralized and defeated after losing a business deal, pacing the lobby of the Mayflower Hotel in the year 1935, conquered insurmountable mental anguish to stay away from the Hotel Bar. Finding hope and direction with his telephone contact with Henrietta Siberling, his optimism is restored. Henrietta, a member of the Oxford Group, has a Drunk, a Dr. Bob Smith, husband of a friend and an Oxford grouper, waiting in the wings.

The very next day, Bill is introduced to Dr. Bob at Henrietta's Gatehouse, and in a quiet small room and six hours later, the two discover the shared benefits of

Dr. Bob never drank again until his death. He sponsored more than 5,000 AA members and left the legacy of his life as an example. Dr. Bob told those he sponsored that there were three things one had to do to keep sober:

TRUST GOD, CLEAN HOUSE, HELP OTHERS.
